PARENT INVOLVEMENT POLICY

GENERAL

This school family engagement policy has been jointly developed and agreed upon with parents of RES students. It will be reviewed and updated annually to meet the changing needs of parents and the school. A copy of this policy will be given to parents each year. Names of individuals involved in the development of this policy are on file in the office.

POLICY INVOLVEMENT

An annual meeting to which all parents of students shall be invited and encouraged to attend will be held each fall. At this meeting this policy, the availability of information concerning teachers' credentials, legal requirements, and the parents' right to be involved will be explained. The meeting will be scheduled at a time convenient to parents. In addition to the annual Open House, a flexible number of meetings (minimum of two) for parents will be held throughout the school year as needed.

Parents are involved in an organized, ongoing, and timely way in the planning, review and improvement of the Title I Schoolwide Program, including the school parental involvement policy through such means as meetings, written and oral communications, conferences, surveys, and parent meetings.

Through such means as the Open House, Parent Teacher conferences, written/oral communications, parent meetings, publications in the local newspaper, formal and informal conferences, local report cards, and State reports, parents of students are provided:

- ... timely information about the Title I Schoolwide Program
- ... information about and interpretation of the school's and child's performance;
- ... a description and explanation of the curriculum, assessment measures and expected proficiency levels for students;
- ... opportunities for sharing experiences, offering suggestions, and as appropriate, participating in making decisions as related to the education for their children; and;
- ... timely responses to their suggestions.

Ramer Elementary School has jointly developed with parents of students a School-Parent Compact that outlines how parents, the entire school staff and students share the responsibility for improved student achievement and the means by which the school and parents will build and develop a partnership to help children achieve the State's high standards.
